Live alongside these historic greens with two championship courses, a sentimental favorite for area golfers. The club was the first public course to open in the state and it just celebrated its 100 year anniversary. Test your skills, play with friends, or practice with the pros, literally right next door.

Northeast Lake

Another neighborhood site, Northeast Lake is a popular fishing and bird-watching spot. This 68-acre lake features bluegill sunfish, bullheads, and largemouth bass for anglers. Aviary enthusiasts will delight in observing the more than 25 species that frequent the shoreline.

The Katy Trail

Hop on this 7-mile paved biking, jogging, and dog-walking trail that weaves right by your new neighborhood. Running parallel to the old Katy Railway, this scenic route connects the Adventure District with Downtown.

Oklahoma Railway Museum

This hands-on experience offers the chance to drive a diesel locomotive or hitch a ride on authentic passenger coaches. Experience the preservation of transportation history along a 4.5 mile stretch from NE 50th to Bricktown. Within walking distance of Rose Rock.

Oklahoma Firefighter Museum

The history of firefighting and its evolution is on full display just a few blocks away. Check out this collection of artifacts dating back to the early 1900s including a dozen restored fire trucks and equipment from pre-World War II to today.

USA Softball Hall of Fame Complex & Museum

Learn about the colorful history of one of the most popular team sports in America and its Olympic debut in the 1990s. A permanent shrine to former players filled with memorabilia, the Hall of Fame Building is also the headquarters of the Amateur Softball Association.

45th Infantry Museum

Exhibits pay tribute to the state's division of the National Guard, known as the Thunderbirds, and other aspects of American military history. Cavalry weapons from the Revolutionary War, a Confederate cannon, and more from World War II through Vietnam are on display.

National Cowboy & Western Heritage Museum

Exceptional works of art tell the story of America's settlement across the West. Historical cowboy gear, firearms, and Native American artifacts are woven together with pop culture and traveling exhibitions. Stroll through galleries, gardens, and an area designed especially for kids.

Science Museum

One of the largest in the nation at 350,000 square feet, this interactive museum includes discovery-based activities, astronomy shows, and live demonstrations. The wonders of science come alive through unique exhibits that provide an unforgettable experience for visiting families.

Remington Park

The state's only racetrack and casino, Remington Park offers quarter horse and thoroughbred stakes, simulcast off-track betting, and more than 750 popular gaming machines. The park is also home to the Oklahoma Horse Racing Hall of Fame and special events throughout the season.

Oklahoma City Zoo & Botanical Garden

Indulge in 120 acres of wildlife from all over the globe. Take a camel ride, mingle with Flamingos, feed giraffes, or go behind the scenes with caretakers for special encounters with bison, bears, rhinos, and elephants.
